
BEAUTIFUL MIND, BETTER THAN A FAIR COMPLEXION

THE WATER CYCLE



MATHEMATICS IS EVERYWHERE

'Mathematics is the language in which God has written the universe" - Galileo Galilei

Mathematics has been an integral part of our lives, present from the moment we are born – be it in our date of birth or the Aadhaar number. From the patterns of the stars to the rhythm of music, maths surround us in ways we rarely notice. Mathematics teaches us one of life's most important skills: problem-solving. When you tackle a math problem, you learn how to think critically, analyse a situation, and come up with creative solutions. Whether you're deciding how to manage your time, planning a project, or solving real-world challenges, maths is always there to guide you.

Be it the seashell, spirals in a sunflower or the perfect snowflakes, they are all gifts of Math with their precise and unique patterns. There exists a Golden Ratio that is evident in objects of aesthetic appeal around us. It is a ratio of two numbers, approximately 1.618. In humans, facial features aligning with the Golden Ratio contribute to perceived beauty.

Nature follows fascinating patterns and Math is like a decoder that helps us make sense of them. There is a fascinating phenomenon called Fibonacci Sequence, in which each number is the sum of the two preceding ones. This creates an aesthetically pleasing patterns, be it in flowers or the spirals of a pinecone. Fractals are another intriguing mathematical sequence in nature. It is a "never ending" self-similar repeating shape. A pinecone, the tree branches and the branches of the neuron inside our brains follow the fractal. Patterns like hexagon in beehives, circles in water ripples, tessellations in the Taj Mahal and conical shape of volcanoes show how deeply math is woven into the world. It is as if nature communicates through a built-in mathematical language, shaping everything we see around us.

It is also crucial in fields like engineering. Architects use geometric principles and ratios to develop floor plans and to create aesthetically appealing structures. Statistics and arithmetic also find its role in architecture and is used for data analyzing and measurements. Games like chess are also mathematical as it comprises numbers, geometric concepts and problem solving. Maths also plays a crucial role in calculating discounts while shopping, managing finances, or measuring ingredients for a recipe. The more you understand maths, the more empowered you will feel to navigate the world with confidence.







Statistician careers

Statisticians are specialists in statistics that is, the collation, analysis, interpretation and presentation of statistics and quantitative data. Statisticians' skills are required in numerous industries, ranging from healthcare to govern-ment and from finance to sport. You'll be tasked with managing, collecting and arranging data by means of sur-veys, experiments and contextual analysis. With your findings, you may then be called upon to create reports and advise clients/colleagues on possible strategies, for example in order to make good financial decisions to further business goals. As a statistician, you'll have expert analytical skills as well as solid communication and IT skills

Actuarial careers

As an actuary, you will be evaluating financial risk in order to manage and advise clients. Combining risk analysis skills with in-depth knowledge of economics and business, actuaries are at the heart of business strategy, ensuring sound investments are made and commercial/business goals fulfilled. New actuaries will most likely be working within pensions and insurance, a relatively low-risk area, while in the future you may get to work in banking, healthcare or investment. Actuarial roles can be client-facing, as with consultancies and pensions/insurance com-panies, and all actuaries will require the skill of communicating complex data and analyses to non-specialists.

Other common Maths careers include; teaching, careers in academia and research, intelligence analysis, operational research, statistical research, logistics, financial analysis, market research (for business), management consultancy, IT (systems analysis, development or research), software engineering, computer programming, the public sector (advisory capacity as a scientist or statistician), scientific research and development (e.g. biotechnology, meteorology or oceanography).

Numeracy, the ability to understand and work with numbers, is extremely sought after and high in demand.























Distinguished Alumnus Visit: Shubham Aggarwal



Miniature Miracle: Christmas


